This report lists work being done by the Script Encoding Initiative (/Universal Scripts Project).

Ongoing Work (including preliminary proposals):

Sharada (L2/08-017): preliminary proposal by Anshuman Pandey

Bamum (L2/07-024): discussion on modern Bamum names is underway with the user community, the Old Bamum proposal is being worked on presently

Manichaean (*L*2/08-025): shaping behavior issues are being ironed out on this proposal by Michael Everson

Mandaic (L2/07-412): expert feedback is being incorporated into a proposal by Michael Everson

Anatolian Hieroglyphs (L2/07-096): glyphs and annotations in this proposal by M. Everson are still under review but critical feedback from H. Craig Melchert at UCLA was received in Dec. 2007

Unified Canadian Aboriginal Syllabics (L2/08-149): additional characters for UCAS are being proposed by Chris Harvey and Michael Everson

Psalter Pahlavi (L2/07-207): punctuation questions remain on this proposal by Michael Everson and Roozbeh Pournader

Book Pahlavi (L2/07-234): Michael Everson, Roozbeh Pournader, and Desmond Durkin-Meisterernst are still working on this proposal

Siyaq numerals (L2/07-414): Anshuman Pandey is working on this; Roozbeh Pournader is relaying information from Iranian specialists

Chakma (L2/08-133): await user community feedback on this preliminary proposal by Michael Everson

Takri (L2/07-419): preliminary proposal by Anshuman Pandey

Khojki: preliminary proposal by Anshuman Pandey

Landa: Anshuman Pandey is working on a document proposing unification of various regional scripts of the Sindh and script types under a "Landa" script

- Varang Kshiti (L2/08-130): preliminary proposal only, user community currently undergoing orthographic reform so this proposal may need to be put on hold *Sorang Sompeng (L2/08-129)*: preliminary proposal only, await user feedback
- Tangut (currently on ballot): Richard Cook will work with the China NB to incorporate into the Tangut proposal a new column with glyphs from a font by Jing Yongshi and mappings from Tangut Document Processing System.

Other Assistance Being Provided

- Miao [Pollard] (China NB, L2/07-299), Yi (China NB, L2/08-193) and Naxi Dongba (L2/08-170): SEI is providing feedback on these proposals
- Alchemical symbols: SEI will meet with a member of Indiana University's project "The Chymistry of Isaac Newton" in June to assist on their alchemical symbols proposal.

Future Activities

- Unicode proposals for Newari, Meroitic, Old Hungarian, and possibly Pahawh Hmong are slated for work in 2008.
- Deborah Anderson is encouraging additional participation from Egyptologists for future work.
- Deborah is also enlisting other linguistics projects (such as the Max Planck Institute in Leipzig and LinguistList) to send in locale data.
- In Fall 2007 and Spring 2008, a student at UC Berkeley has been working through the L2 doc registry and identifying documents (proposals and feedback) by script block.
- Proposals for missing Greek papyrological signs is underway (in conjunction with UC Berkeley), along with work on Arabic math symbols and miscellaneous symbols used in the sciences.
