ADDENDUM TO UNICODE PROPOSAL - U.S. FLAG



My proposal is to encode the United States (U.S.) flag as a Unicode character.

The U.S. flag is one of the world's most recognized symbols. It is commonly used to symbolize nationality (American), country (United States of America), and language (English). It is express in political, economic, social and athletic environments.

The users of the U.S. flag symbol are principally American residents, including citizens and non-citizens. U.S. Census Bureau estimates that as of February 5, 2012, there were more than 312.9 million residents in the United States. However, there are many examples of international uses of the flag that deserve mention.

Here the U.S. flag is being used to denote the source of origin of a bag of wheat in Port au Prince, Haiti, February 2009.²

The Federation Internationale de Football Association (FIFA) uses the U.S. flag on its website as a shorthand way to identify the American national soccer team:



Apple, Inc. employs the U.S. flag to denote American English within their operating software user interface:³

The most appropriate place for a new U.S. flag character within the Unicode Code Chart is under Symbols and Punctuation - Other Symbols - Miscellaneous Symbols - Miscellaneous Symbols AndPictographs. This section already has two flag symbols (Crossed Flags and Chequered Flag), has a symbol relating to the United States (American Football), and generally corresponds best among all sections for placement of the U.S. flag character.
