1. Introduction

Recently, the Wingdings/Webdings symbol set was decided to be encoded due to its widespread accessibility on a large set of equipment (especially, but not confined to, computers equipped with Microsoft's Windows operating system), without having to prove the actual use of every single symbol in real existing text.

This argument also applies to the Bodoni Ornaments symbol set present on every mobile device (iPhone, iPad) recently produced by Apple. Moreover, the access to these symbols is far more easy to the common user, as the symbols are contained in a font (also named "Bodoni Ornaments") where they are mapped to the basic set of Latin characters, decimal digits and punctuation marks. Thus, the common user is invited to simply type letters using the standard keyboard (rather than being obliged to access symbol tables or other input methods).




Fig. 2: Screenshot from an Apple iPad, using the original Apple app "Pages" to enter a document using the Bodoni Ornaments font.

This is demonstrated in fig. 2 to 4 (see the end of this document before the summary form).

Of course, mapping symbols to other encoded characters is an obsolete technology. (The handling of emoji on the same devices by e.g. supplying easily switchable virtual keyboards proves that up-to-date technology can be applied without compromises on the user's experience.)

To ensure that the use of such symbols is in accordance with up-to-date technology (and thus ensuring the identity of the text using such symbols), it is necessary to encode them as Unicode characters.

This is proposed here.

1.1 The Origin of the Bodoni Ornaments set

All symbols contained in the Bodoni Ornaments font are *exact reproductions* from a collection created by the renowned typograph Giambattista Bodoni (1740–1813). This collection was published by his widow as part of the "Manuale Tipografico" 1818 in Parma (Italy). A specimen of this rare print is located at the Bayerische Staatsbibliothek (National Library of Bavaria, Munich, Germany), where the author was able to make scans with a digital microscope of every character proposed here. (These scans are available from the author on request.)

Due to this date of first publication, no copyright can be claimed on the symbols. Thus, there is no obstacle to encode them and to publish them in code charts.

The original set published by Bodoni contains 1036 symbols, published on pp. 184–251 of vol. 2 of that edition. There, they are called "Fregi", which in today's orthography would be "Freghi" and translates as "doodles". The complete set is shown by reduced scans in the Appendix.

The font containing the selection proposed here was created by Sumner Stone somewhen before 2000 for the International Typeface Corporation / Monotype Imaging (from where it is available for other devices than the Apple devices which contain them on delivery). No rationale for the specific selection from the original Bodoni set is found.

1a. Notes on this preliminary proposal

In this document, the original font purchased from ITC font is used which resembles the one found on the Apple devices. However, all glyphs shown here are bitmap graphics, to avoid any font embedding.

The final proposal has to use glyph designs which are in line with other representative glyphs in the Unicode charts, thus being less fancy and more abstract. The latter especially applies to the symbols proposed to be included in the "Geometric Shapes Extended" block.

2. Encoding Considerations

For two glyphs of the Bodoni Ornaments set, the following unifications are proposed:



(glyph for U+0021): U+1F31E SUN WITH FACE



The symbols \sum (glyph for U+2264) and \sum (glyph for U+00B1) are considered as ornaments rather than mathematical characters, and therefore are not unified with them.

The remaining set is subdivided as follows:

- A small set which can be regarded as geometric shapes is placed into the existing block "Geometric Shapes Extended".
- 2. All other symbols are placed into a new block "Ornamental Dingbats Supplement". There, the "flat" symbols are placed in the first column, where some room is left for the case that small sets of similar symbols are proposed later from other sources (like the Hoefler Text ornaments). The other symbols are placed into that block from the second column on, ordered by their number in the original Bodoni set.

All symbols are named using their number in the original Bodoni set, except where a resemblance to an encoded symbol is obvious. In these cases, they are named in analogy to the resembled symbol, while the name based on the original Bodoni number is given as an "alternative name".

3. Proposed Characters

All characters proposed here are symbols, and therefore have the properties:










Fig. 4: Only after installing the Bodoni Ornaments font on the PC and selecting it, the document from fig. 3 appears correct (the last fleuron in the second line in fact is the Word paragraph marker ¶, by its code point).





