

Gabonese and Ivorian Latin characters

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In Michael Everson, Denis Jacquerye, Chris Lilley, *Proposal for the addition of ten Latin characters to the UCS* ([L2/12-270](#), N4297) the proposed characters LATIN CAPITAL LETTER OMEGA and LATIN SMALL LETTER OMEGA are described as “used in Gabonese orthographies” on page 1. This is a mistake as they are used in some Kulango publications from Bondoukou (not Bondoukou) as described on page 6 and not in any of the *Alphabet scientifique des langues du Gabon*, *Orthographe des langues du Gabon* or *Rapidolangue* (all various orthography systems used in Gabon). Kulango is a language spoken in Côte d’Ivoire not in Gabon. The same mistake is in the description of the LATIN CAPITAL LETTER SMALL CAPITAL I which is used in the same Kulango publications with the Latin omega. The character group *Letters for Gabonese orthographies* of Latin Extended-D should therefore not include the Latin omega characters or its name should be rectified to *Letters for African languages*.
