

Subject: Proposal to add informative notes and cross-reference to U+F92C and U+F9B8

The mappings of two Han characters (Korean hanja in this case) from KS X 1001 were changed in Unicode 6.1.

- K0-522B: U+F92C 郎 → U+FA2E 郎
- K0-6766: U+F9B8 隸 → U+FA2F 隸

These mapping changes were requested by the Korean National Body, as the canonical mappings of U+F92C and U+F9B8 are wrong but cannot be changed.

In the current Unicode code chart, it is difficult to find out why and where those mappings were moved.

Proposed changes

In order to clearly show what changes were made (so that the users can clearly be informed of these by looking at the code chart), I propose to add the following informative notes (to both characters) and the following cross-reference (to U+F92C only, as U+F9B8 already has a cross-reference).

To U+F92C 郎:

- mapping change removed original source; original source is moved to FA2E 郎
→ 90DE 郎 cjk unified ideograph-90DE

To U+F9B8 隸:

- mapping change removed original source; original source is moved to FA2F 隸

The code chart should look something like this:
