
## 1. Infrastructure improvements

Michel and Liang plan to work together to source control the files specific to the production of the French charts.

Taking advantage of the private "representative-glyphs" repo, Liang created experimental, internal tooling to enable simpler and more reliable review of representative glyph changes:



#### 2. Version 17.0 recap

The release went smoothly.

Layout changes proposed in the <u>last report</u> about page margins and logical page numbers were implemented as planned. Liang started producing release candidate (RC) charts in early August (one month before the release day), and the eventually released RC was produced mid-August. Richard revised the source controlled charts index pages (English and French) by the end of August.

The code charts participated in the Release Management WG's experiment of utilizing a staging server. Eventually the files were deployed from staging to production by Gregg.

The private "representative-glyphs" repo and its private npm package have been updated in coordination with the release.

Some glyph errata notices were posted before the release and are now visible on the Errata fixed in Unicode 17.0.0 page.

French charts were produced by Michel in early October, and deployed to production on October 16. Note that French charts aren't a part of the release plan, and tend to arrive late.

## 3. Version 18.0 plan

Michel plans to migrate certain scripts to new chart fonts:

- Latin, Cyrillic, Greek: <u>Times New Roman</u>, to be licensed from Microsoft
- Armenian: Noto Serif Armenian, OFL
- Khitan Small Script: Khitan Small Linear, licensing to be clarified
