- A. Accepted in part. The term RIAL in the name will be changed to RIEL.
- B1. Rejected. Khmer linguists insist that these are distinct characters which must be coded separately. They are used chiefly in transliteration, for instance of Sanskrit.
- B2. Rejected. This is the normal way that Long A is represented in Brahmic scripts in the UCS.
- B3. Rejected. Khmer linguists have indicated that these are required for lexical work and must be distinguished in coded text.
- B4. Rejected. The stand-alone form of these characters can be represented by preceding the characters with a space.
- B5. Rejected. The Virama model is used for Khmer.
