A Tai Xuan Jing symbol comprises a combination of three elements: tian, di and ren, and these three Chinese words usually translates to heaven, earth and human, respectively. The character names of the six Tai Xuan Jing symbols in this International Standard, however, are based on an uncommon mapping; tian for heaven, di for human, and ren for earth. Users are advised to identify these symbols by their representative glyphs or Chinese annotations but not character names.
