RE: Kaithi Decomposition Questions for Unicode 5.2

1. Background

The Kaithi script will appear in Unicode 5.2. Upon a close reading of the script proposal (L2/08-194), decomposition and normalization issues have been discovered and a decision needs to be made by the UTC for 5.2. (The result of this decision will impact the Takri script, which also had forms being proposed which contained nuktas.)

2. Letters in Kaithi with Nukta

a. The proposal (p. 35) calls out the nukta, U+110BA KAITHI SIGN NUKTA, as "commonly used to distinguish" two characters, BA from VA, but does not provide a decomposition for VA. The nukta appears also in the formation of two other characters (RHA and DDDHA), which were separately encoded but have no decompositions.

b. The proposal states that the letter YA does appear without a nukta. However, this un-nuktated YA is considered a stylistic variant, so is not separately proposed.

c. The proposal also mentions that nukta appears under various Kaithi letters for sounds in Urdu (such as under KAITHI LETTER JA). In *Kaithi o Hindi barnamala*, the nukta appears under the KAITHI LETTERS KA, KHA, and PHA for sounds not native to Hindi phonology. Since the forms in *Kaithi o Hindi barnamala* are not generally listed in the inventories of Kaithi letters, the proposal says "[the letters with nukta] may be considered a late innovation" and the nukta should be employed to create such letters, as needed.

3. Questions:

- a. Should VA ⁹ get a decomposition? Should RHA ⁶ and DDDHA ⁹ also get a decomposition (even though the proposal didn't explicitly call them out)?
- b. How should YA $^{\mathcal{Y}}$ be documented, if the others get decompositions?
- c. If any of the above do get decompositions, should entries be added to CompositionExclusions.txt for Unicode 5.2, so that the *preferred* form, even in NFD, is the precomposed letter as encoded (as for the Devanagari nuktated forms)?
