This will confirm my support for the current version of the "Proposal to Encode the Siddham Script in ISO/IEC 10646.

I am the former President of Shuchi-in University in Kyoto, Japan. This University was founded by Kukai in the early ninth century and has used siddham in the current form since then. The font is consistent with what we use at the University. It is important to encode siddham so that it can be used more professionally in the curriculum.

Rev. Eidson and Rev. Harada-Eidson have attended many Priest training courses at the University for a number of years. All of these courses use siddham in the text.

I have worked with Rev. Eidson and Rev. Harada-Eidson from Tenchiji Temple and The Shingon Buddhist international institute on the development of a Unicode proposal for Siddham since 2007. It has been a long time since we were presented with the concept and have been periodically updated on it.

We are pleased that a proposal is being submitted to the Unicode Technical Committee and hope that it will be approved as a foundation to create a useable system for siddham.
