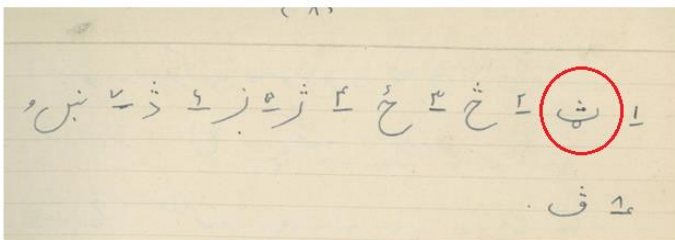

The author requests the encoding for a character used in Shughni/Roshani language.

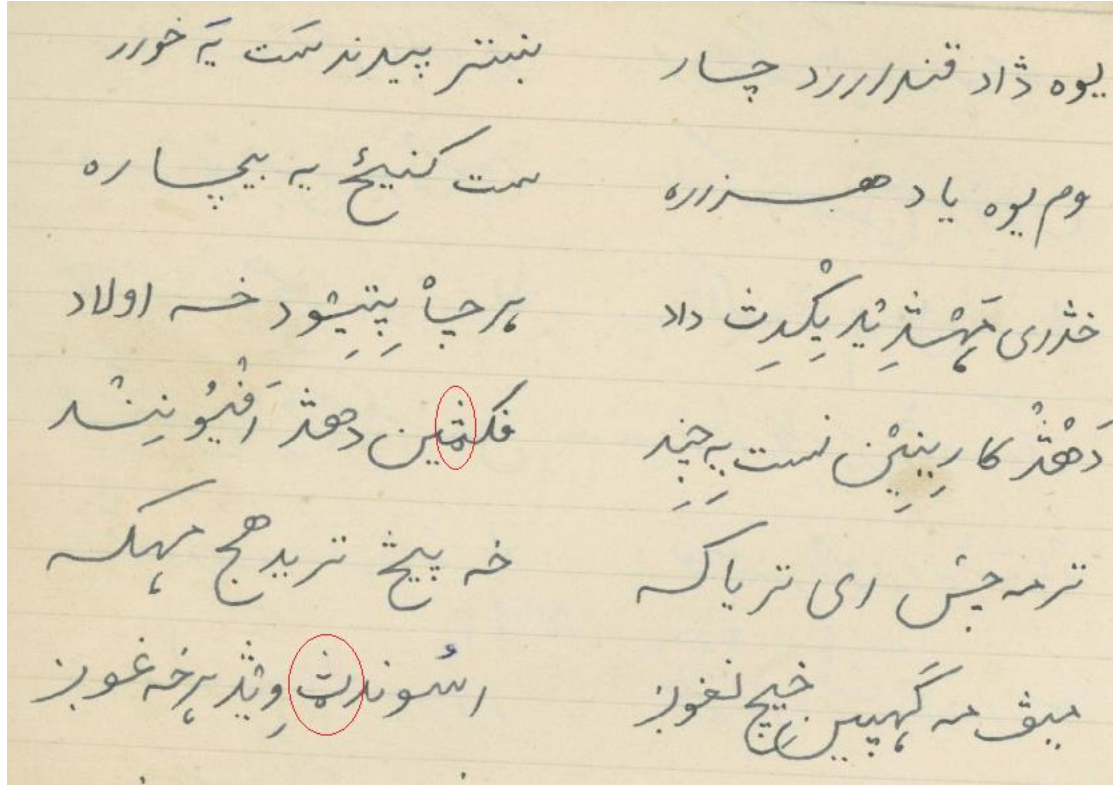
