

Proposal to change the code chart font for Wancho

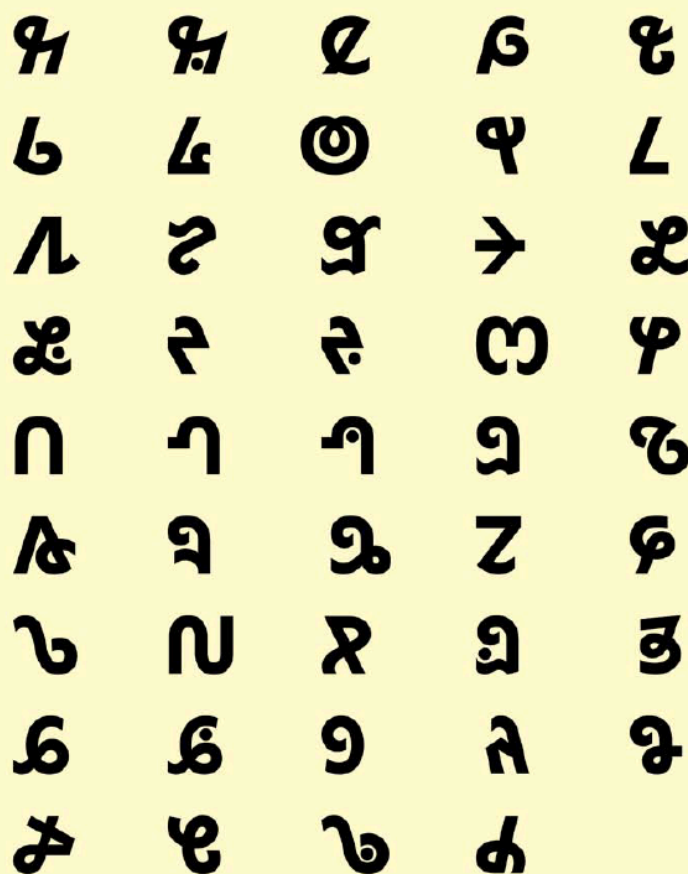
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This document proposes to change the code chart font for Wancho. After the initial Unicode proposal and current code chart were made the representative shapes for Wancho were updated and simplified by Banwang Losu, the creator of the script. In general the slant has been reduced in some glyphs to improve spacing and some shapes have been simplified. The newer style is currently used in the primer and workbook used to teach Wancho script. The glyphs in *Figure 1* use a Bold Display weight with updated style. However, the requested representative glyphs use a Regular weight as shown in *Figure 3*.

CHAPTER 1: ALPHABET

One notable change is the placement of the dot on 1E2EA.



The old shape for U+1E2EA could be confused for U+1E2DE with a diacritic tone mark (U+1E2EC). The new shape assumes the inherent dot is inside the glyph so it won't be confused.

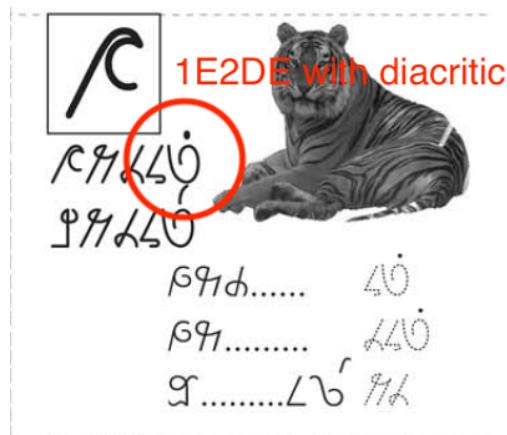


Figure 2. Example of 1E2DE with diacritic dot

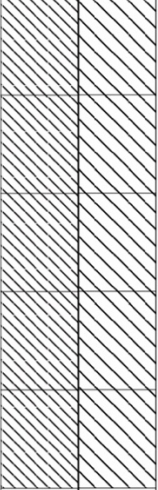
