# Addendum to L2/21-107, Cyrillic modifier letters

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2021 June 25

The addition of two characters is requested for the new Cyrillic modifier block. Feedback to the initial posting of L2/21-107 noted that the character U+04AB CYRILLIC SMALL LETTER ES WITH DESCENDER, which had been used in an illustration, was not decomposable into Cyrillic es + cedilla, and that the modifier variant therefore warranted its own code point. At around the same time, Sebastian Kempgen, of the Commission for Computer Supported Processing of Medieval Slavonic Manuscripts and Early Printed Books, requested a modifier variant of an additional character, U+A651 CYRILLIC SMALL LETTER YERU WITH BACK YER.
