This document includes

11 the ESC's recommendations for UTC approval of 21 draft emoji candidates for Unicode 15.0; and 2 a recommendation that the UTC stop accepting emoji flag proposals that formerly qualified under Category F4.

1. ESC Emoji Recommendations for Unicode 15.0 1

Our recommendations for Unicode 15.0 are derived from existing provisional emoji candidates and emoji that were previously added to larger lists. We are proposing a total of 21 draft emoji candidates, all of which require new code points. Two of them require skin tone modifier sequences. Among these 21 proposed draft emoji candidates, BLACK BIRD was a previous draft emoji candidate. The following is a breakdown of the proposed draft emoji candidates by category, from most to least:

Animals and Nature: 7 Smileys and Emotion: 4

• Objects: 2

• Food and Drink: 2 • People and Hands: 2

• Activities: 2 • Symbols: 2

2. No Longer Accepting Emoji in Category F4 Submissions



The Emoji Subcommittee receives a large number of proposals to introduce identity flags into the Unicode Standard. There are significant challenges with such flag proposals, such as their transient nature (many identity flag designs have changed since their addition in 2016) and rationale (inclusion of one identity invites questions as to why other identities aren't also included and sets expectations that any identity should be supported, which cannot scale for either Unicode or vendors).

As discussed in previous reports, flags are the least frequently-used emoji, and yet consume a non-trivial portion of emoji fonts' file size. After years of consideration, the Emoji Subcommittee will no longer intake flag proposals based on <u>Category F4</u>. We encourage vendors to instead support inline images, such as stickers, GIFs, and so on.
