# Proposal to add capital rams horn

## 1. Introduction

This is a proposal to add LATIN CAPITAL LETTER RAMS HORN, an uppercase form of U+0264 LATIN SMALL LETTER RAMS HORN. The Eastern Dan orthography of 2014, created by Valentin Vydrin in collaboration with Emmanuel Zeh and five other Eastern Dan alphabetization experts, uses the letter and, being a bicameral orthography, uses both an uppercase form and a lowercase form of the letter. Easter Dan is spoken in Côte d'Ivoire by 650.000 people in the prefectures of Man, Sipilou and Biancouma, and is part of the Dan, Gio or Yacouba linguistic continuum (ISO 639-3: dnj]) estimated to be spoken by more than a million speakers in Côte d'Ivoire and Liberia. The dialect of Gouèta is the basis of most written Eastern Dan works. The 2014 orthography has been used in books and journals, including *-Pamebhame*, a periodical published in Eastern Dan and Western Dan since 2005. The Eastern Dan edition adopted the orthography in 2019 and its name is now spelled *Päbhēnbhābhēn*. Several of these works are available on the Bibliothèque électronique dan (*Eletronic Dan Library*) hosted by a collaboration between the Côte d'Ivoire NGO Päbhēnbhābhēn, and the two French institutions Laboratoire Langues et Cultures d'Afrique Noire (LLCAN) and Institut des Langues et Civilisations Orientales (INALCO). The Eastern Dan–French dictionary was published in 2021 with the new orthography and is avaiable as a website as well.

In the 2014 Eastern Dan orthography, the  $\tau$  U+0264 LATIN SMALL LETTER RAMS HORN replaced what was written with  $\ddot{v}$  and  $\ddot{o}$  in the 1982 Eastern Dan orthography.

The character is available in some SIL fonts as a PUA character. With other fonts, it is approximated with a lowercase at a larger size than the rest of the text.

The capital rams horn cannot be represented with other currently encoded characters. U+0194 LATIN CAPITAL LETTER GAMMA may have a similar shape in some fonts, but it generally extends under the baseline, which capital rams horn cannot do. Additionally, the capital shape of Latin gamma typically has straight terminals while, as confirmed by Vydrin in private communication, the capital rams horn should have curved terminals like the lowercase to avoid ambiguity between the two letters.
