1. ESC Emoji Recommendations for Unicode 18.0 🏛️

We are recommending a short list of nine new characters (shown below) and the removal of one, U+1FADD APPLE CORE, from the Unicode 18.0 list



[185-C] Consensus: Accept nine (9) new emoji characters with the following character names, based on Section 1 of document L2/25-230, for Unicode 18.0:

FACE WITH SQUINTING EYES
 LEFTWARDS THUMB SIGN
 RIGHTWARDS THUMB SIGN
 PICKLE
 MONARCH BUTTERFLY
 METEOR
 ERASER
 LIGHTHOUSE
 NET WITH HANDLE

Of the recommended emoji, two (Leftwards Thumb Sign and Rightwards Thumb Sign) accept skin tone modifiers, bringing the total number of sequences to 19.

2. Update on Interoperability Audit

As noted in [L2/25-008](#) and [L2/25-089](#), our multi-quarter effort to improve interoperability is moving forward. Below are the key findings and notes on notable emoji included in study.

Key Findings

1. Direction and color rarely play a role in emoji interpretation

Where emoji differ with regard to direction or color, this rarely results in preference differences in participants.

2. Animals need bodies

For all Unicode animal labels, full-body designs were by far the most preferred - animals are more than just a cute face.

3. Superfluous visual details impact interpretation

Some designs are better at representing specific concepts than others because of the individual details. For example, inclusion of contents makes some designs for BASKET (its official name) less likely to be associated with that label, but good candidates for LAUNDRY or PICNIC.

4. Additional details can emphasize core meaning

There are moments where extra little details can really improve selection, if they are relevant. For example, showing some cable as part of ELECTRIC PLUG or light beams as part of FLASHLIGHT.

5. CLDR words don't always match emoji designs

Some designs are far more likely or unlikely to be chosen for specific labels. For example, all current designs for LEG are poor candidates for representing KICK, even though KICK is a CLDR keyword for that emoji.

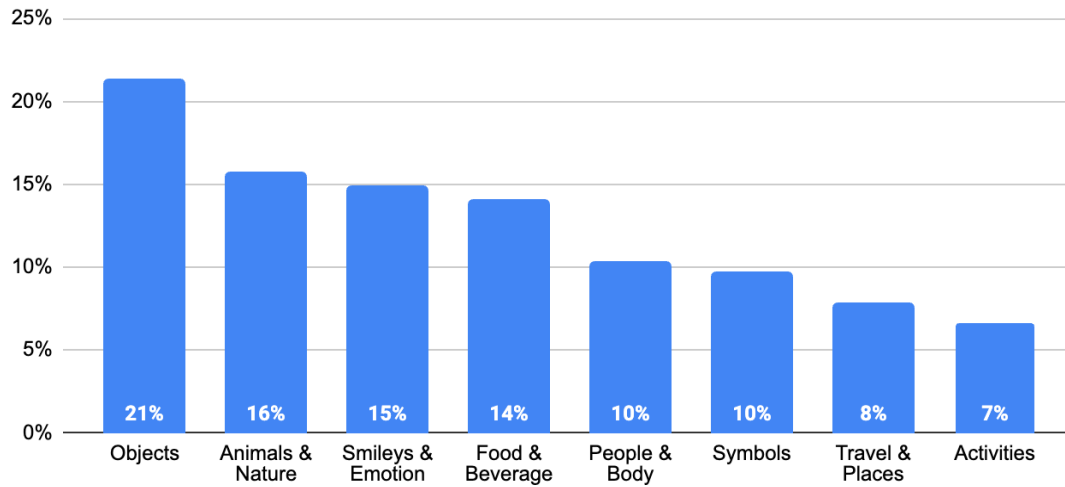

	PERSON KNEELING	Different meaning	Yes	Maybe	Standardise to dual knee position. If single knee is important, then propose new addition.

3. Intake for Unicode 18.0 🗺️



The submission period for 2025 emoji proposals is now complete. The largest category (Objects) represented one fifth of all proposals despite being one of the least-used types of emoji. The ESR WG will continue to review and provide feedback for proposals that were submitted during the April-July submission period.

Looking back on emoji approved over the past few years, the number of proposals continues to increase but the number of emoji we recommend is not. The ESR Working Group remains committed to identifying ways to improve the Unicode Standard beyond just adding new emoji year over year but also improving the existing set and the experience using them.
