 - used to mark long /i:/ vowel when pausing recitation
- 10EF1 ٲ ARABIC SQUARE BELOW
- placed below the letter reh to indicate that the letter should be pronounced lightly without pharyngealization
- 10EF2 ٲ ARABIC FILLED SQUARE BELOW
- placed below the letter lam to indicate that the letter should be pronounced with pharyngealization

Quranic naql marks

These characters are used to mark naql, when there is a hamza after tanween, according to Warsh narration, the vowel of the hamza is moved to tanween so that it is pronounced as the letter noon.
