The matter of the Source Code Separation Examples found in ISO/IEC JTC1/SC2/WG2 N1429, *Draft Text of CJK Annex for IS/HS Revision*, clause S.4 was discussed. A concern was raised that the addition of a **G** to every example may lead to the impression that new national standards were being added so as to cause the addition of new source separation exceptions to unification rules.

We encourage the IRG to address this by documenting whether or not new source separation exceptions are being added; and, if not, to explain the appearance of **G** in every example. We do not believe it is absolutely necessary to actually modify the text of the proposed Annex S, clause S.4; however, if the IRG wishes to clarify the annotations provided for each example so as to indicate the exact source set being referenced, then they are encouraged to do so.
