After IRG#21 meeting in Guilin, Chinese IRG editors rechecked questionable C1 characters raised by IRG editors, and provided an evidence list with comments help from Japan and HKSAR.

According to comments gathered in IRG#21, the Chinese editors rechecked our proposal on IICOR (IRG N991), and prepared a new proposal containing 5,080 characters, 2,104 characters less than the previous one.

Some Chinese editors attended the 2nd Chinese Digitalization Forum (CDF) in Hong Kong during 23 to 25 February 2004.

The Public Security Ministry of China is preparing to issue the 2nd generation of identification card (IC card). All necessary information will be recorded electronically. The Public Security Ministry of China has decided apply ISO/IEC 10646 to its IT system. Some testing ID cards have been issued in a few main cities in China.
