Chinese IRG editors reviewed CJK\_C1 set as scheduled at IRG#22 meeting in Chengdu.

After IRG#22, Beijing Normal University (北京師範大學) and Southeast China Normal University (華東師範大學) studied an encoding scheme for four kinds of old hanzi, i.e. Oracle (甲骨文), Bronze inscription (金文), Chu Script of Warring States (戰國楚文) and Small Seal (小篆), and finished character lists for them respectively. A formal proposal on Old Hanzi Encoding is being prepared.

In order to accelerate the implementation of CJK\_B in China, some standards of dot matrix fonts have been developed.
