1. After Macao SAR reviewed the CJK Extension C1 V5.1 (N1142), we have noted that there are 9 characters submitted by us placed as “Glyph Error”. We submitted glyph replacement to the Chief Editor on 29 September 2005, and the refined glyphs are as follows:

2. In CJK Extension C1 V5.1-D51 (N1142) document, one of the characters submitted by Macao SAR (C1 No. 15747) is suggested to be unified with another character (C1 No. 15755). Macao SAR suggests the two characters cannot be unified, as the prior one (C1 No. 15747) is now used in person names in Macao.
3. Besides point 1 mentioned, we found that there are 7 character glyphs submitted by us before, currently in CJK Extension C1 V5.1-E51 (N1142), are not so standardized. Therefore, we also submitted refined glyphs to the Chief Editor on 29 Sept 2005:

4. Macao SAR has reviewed the CJK Extension C1 V5.2 (N1151) issued in late October 2005, and noted that the glyph replacements (mentioned in point 1 and 3 above) have not been consolidated. It would be greatly appreciated if the glyph replacements can be reviewed and accepted in IRG#25. Macao SAR expects that all 22 characters submitted can be included in CJK Extension C1.
