Title: Suggestions in encoding Taoist Secret Characters
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1. Suggestions

To encode only the **Secret Names (讳名)** of famous Taoist gods and ghosts under the rule of multiple evidences after careful studies. Not to encode other Taoist Secret Characters used in Taoist talismans or incantations in CJKUI.

2. Introduction

Taoist talismans (道教符箓) have been widely used to eliminate disasters, evils and misfortunes in China. To make the talismans seem authoritative and more effective, Taoist priests always create **Secret Characters (讳字, also called 讳秘字)** or patterns, make the strokes more crooked or cursive and add decorative strokes to base characters.

A Taoist talisman can be complicated with many Secret Characters, patterns and decorative strokes or be composed of a single Secret Character.

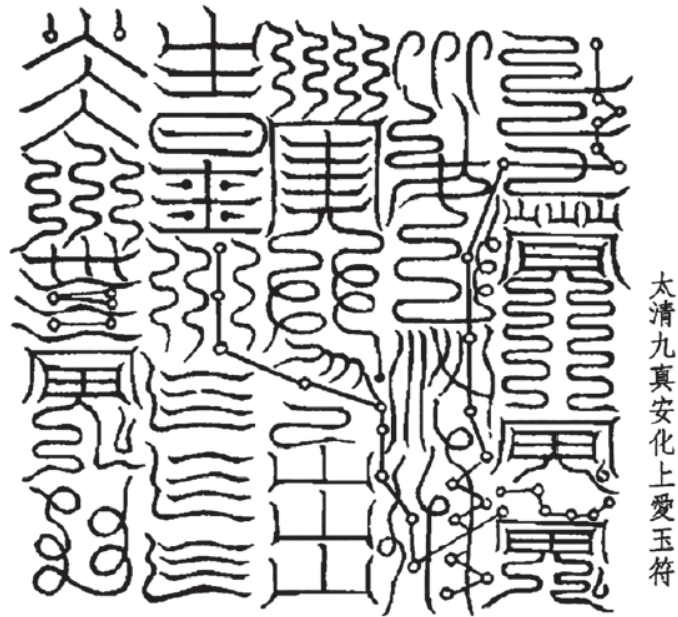


Fig.2 A complicated Taoist talisman found in 《正统道藏》

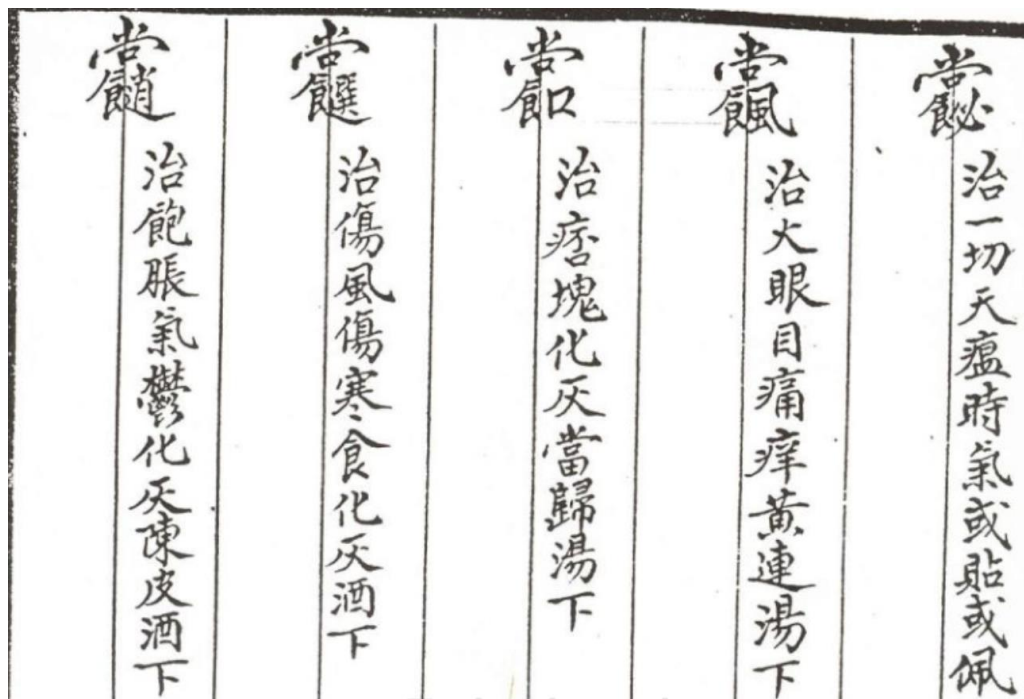


Fig.3 Simple Taoist talismans containing only one Secret Character

Since a Taoist talisman can be a single Secret Character, the names of different parts of a Taoist talisman, i.e. **head** (符头), **heart** (符窍), **foot** (符脚), can be also applied to describe Secret Characters. Normally, a Secret Character contains head and foot but written heart.

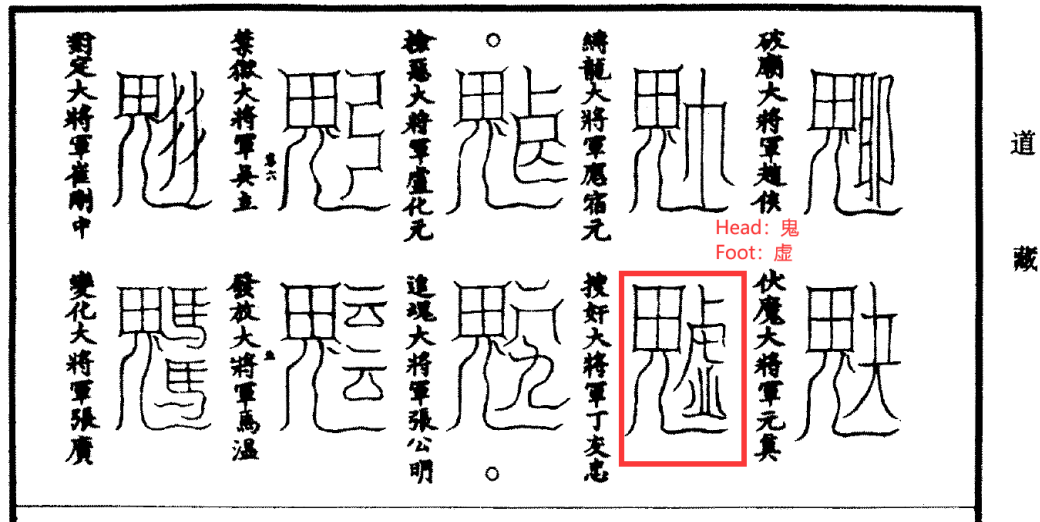


Fig.4 The head and foot of a Single-Character Taoist talisman

The **Secret Names** (i.e. the Secret Characters used to represent their names) of Taoist gods and ghosts can be used as normal Secret Characters as well. The following talisman is composed of three Secret Names of Taoist gods. The talisman has only heart, but head or foot. “三清帝令入吾水中，助我退病” is the incantation of the talisman.

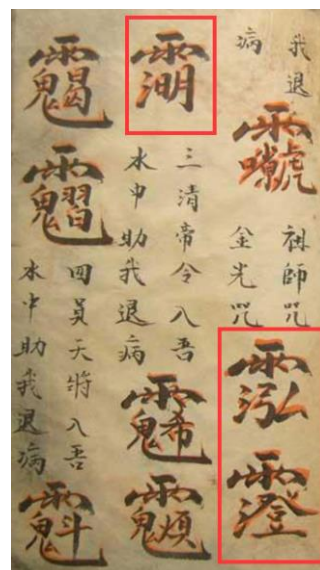


Fig.5 A Taoist talisman using Secret Names of Taoist gods

Because 玉清、上清、太清 are very significant gods in the system of Taoist mythologies, the forms of their Secret Names vary little. The other Secret Characters created for Taoist talisman, however, are variable and created much more casually.

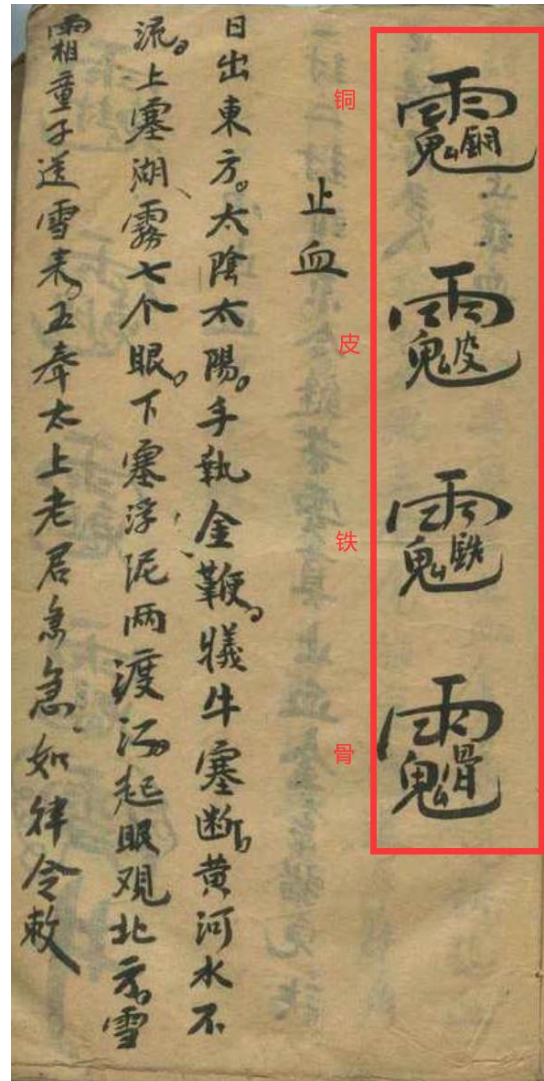


Fig.6 A Taoist talisman used to stop bleeding

Fig.6 shows a Taoist talisman used to stop bleeding. If the “雨” and “鬼” of the four Secret Characters are excluded, we can get a word meaning “copper skin and iron bone (铜皮铁骨)”.

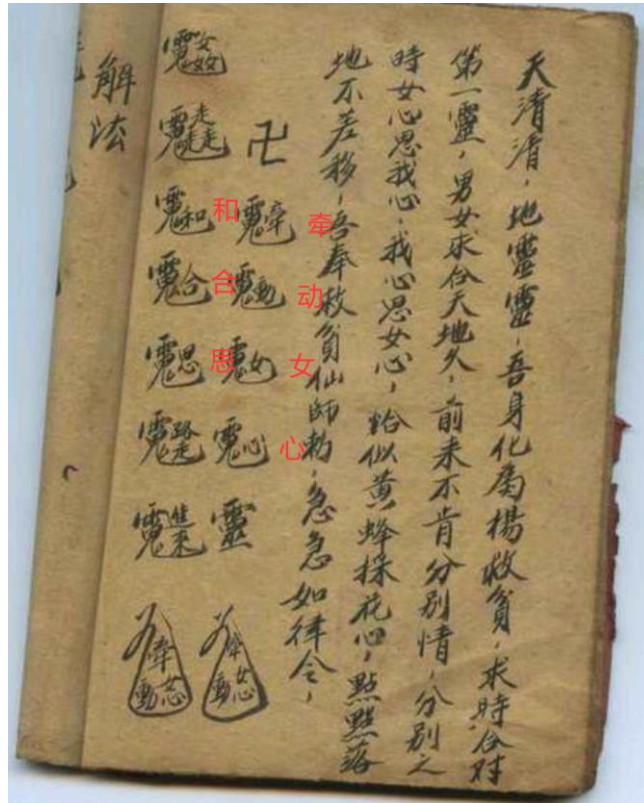


Fig.7 A Taoist talisman used to court

Fig.7 shows another Taoist talisman used to court. If the “雨” and “鬼” are excluded, we can get words like “牵动女心 (get the girl moved)” and “和合思” (hope it goes smoothly) .

This means the foot of Secret Characters can vary as the Taoist priests like, which indicates the encoding of the Secret Characters is endless.

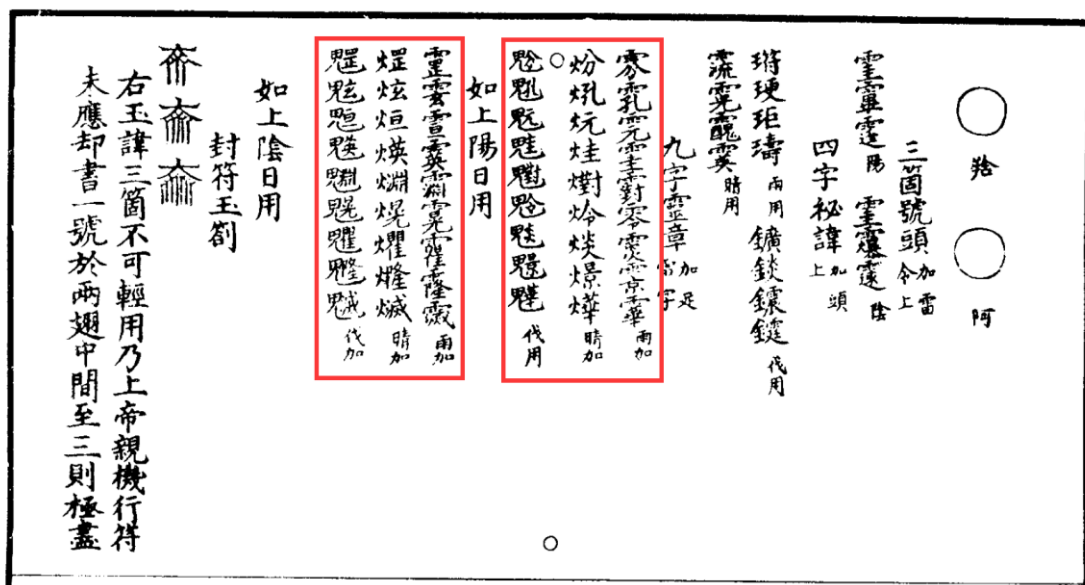


Fig.8 Different Secret Characters with same foot

What's more, the head of Secret Characters can vary, too. It depends on the usage, effect, sect, etc. of the talisman. Fig.8 shows different Secret Characters with the same foot. The head depends on weather or usage.

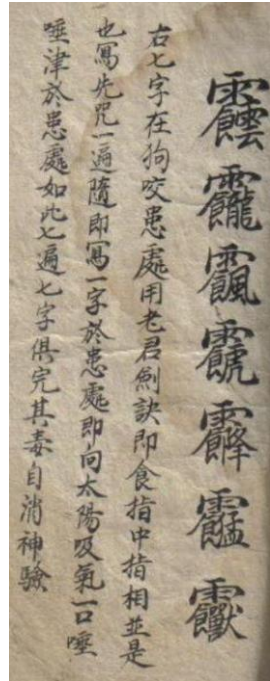


Fig.9 The head composed of 雨 and 食

Fig.9 shows Secret Characters using 雨 and 食 as head, with the foot saying “Let cloud, dragon, wind and tiger beat the crazy beast (云龙风虎降猛兽)”. The talisman is used to cure dog bites.

According to the above, it's not possible nor reasonable to encode Taoist Secret Characters one by one in CJKUI.

3. Encoding suggestions

First, I'd like to respond to two opinions.







The one saying “Taoist Secret Characters is the same with other CJKUIs and can be used among them”. After reading the text, I think it's very clear that the fact is the opposite. And “can be used among CJKUIs” does not mean anything. For example: “☺”是个笑脸，用于表达快乐的心情，可以读作“笑”。(☺ is a smiling face used to express your happiness. You can read it as “smile”).)

The other saying “We have encoded some Taoist Secret Characters so we can encode more”. In my opinion, it's a little ridiculous. An improper analogy would be to commit a crime: I have been in prison so I can break the law again. We have encoded some duplicates in CJKUI, but I believe none of us want to encode more.

Let's go back to the point. For Taoist Secret Characters, considering the Secret Names of famous Taoist gods and ghosts are stable and the amount of them is limited, I suggest we encode just these characters in CJKUI. Moreover, the characters appear in Taoist incantations can be related to the Secret Characters thus the necessity to study them carefully first.

Instead of encoding Taoist Secret Characters one by one, we should seek other ways to solve the problem. Since there are several heads of Taoist Secret Characters, I think a new encoding model or solving the problem in other level, for instance, type setting may be preferred.

Moreover, some common symbols in Taoist talismans can be encoded. For example, when used at

the top of a talisman,  represents “三清”; use  or  as “三官大帝”; use  as “北斗七星神”; use  and  to represent 五行; etc.

4. Problems we may face

Here are some kinds of problems we will meet if my suggestions are accepted. If we decide to encode Taoist Secret Characters characters one by one, the problems will become much more difficult to solve.

4.1 Simplified form

Daoist Secret characters often contain CJKUIs as its elements, so they can be simplified as well.

For example, the Secret Names of the gods of The Big Dipper:

If we decide to encode just the Secret Names of famous Taoist gods and ghosts, it's OK to encode the simplified ones if proper evidences are provided.

4.2 Which Secret Characters to choose

There are many gods or ghosts in the system of Taoist mythologies while people keep creating new ones, especially the demons that need to be swept. It's hard to decide which is famous and which is not. I suggest we involve experts of Taoist Secret Characters in related work.

Note that there are other compound characters used to represent gods or ghosts. I don't know how to handle these ones. For example, Secret Characters appear in Fig.11 and Fig.12.

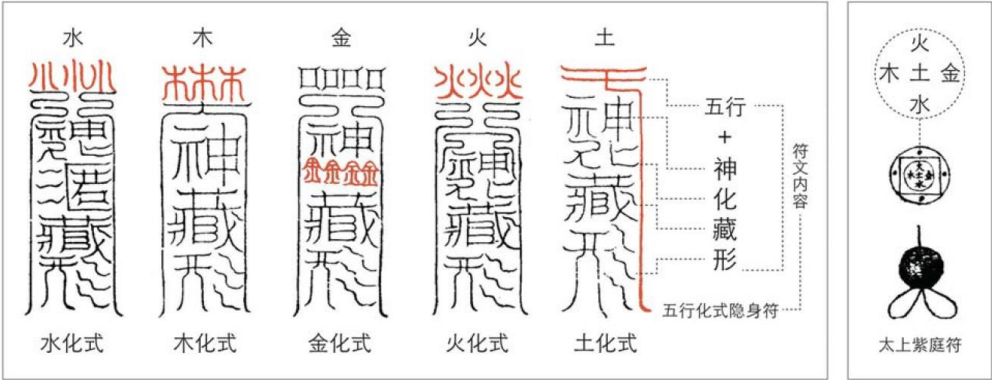


图 36. 五行式隐身符

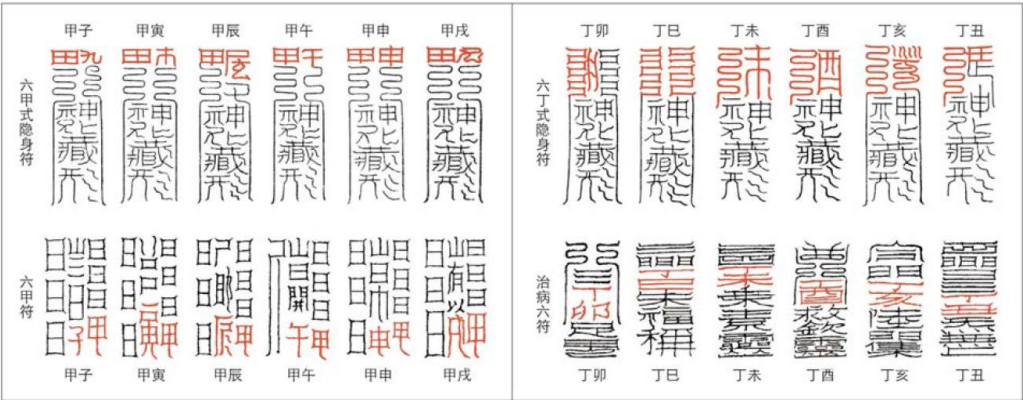


图 32. 六甲六丁神符举例

1) The [UK-20704](#) (目雨言門丁玉) in IRG WS2021:

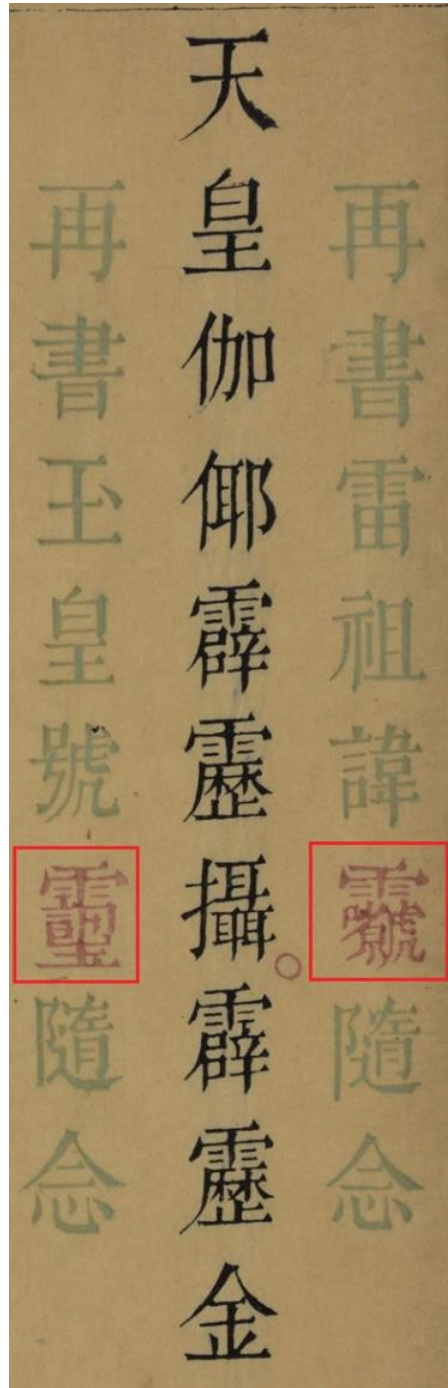


Fig.13 Evidence of [UK-20704](#)

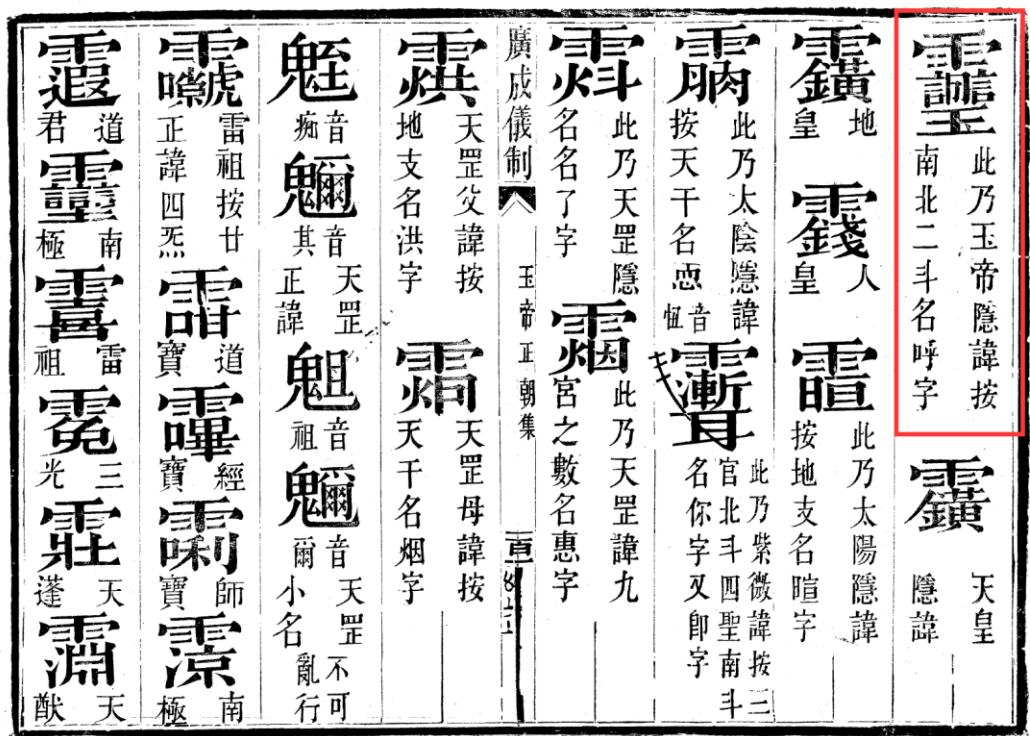


Fig.14 The Secret Name of Yu Huang in 《广成仪制·玉帝正朝集》

4) The Secret Name of Yu Huang in a handwritten copy of Daoist Secret characters. Note that the missing stroke of the character is not meaningless.

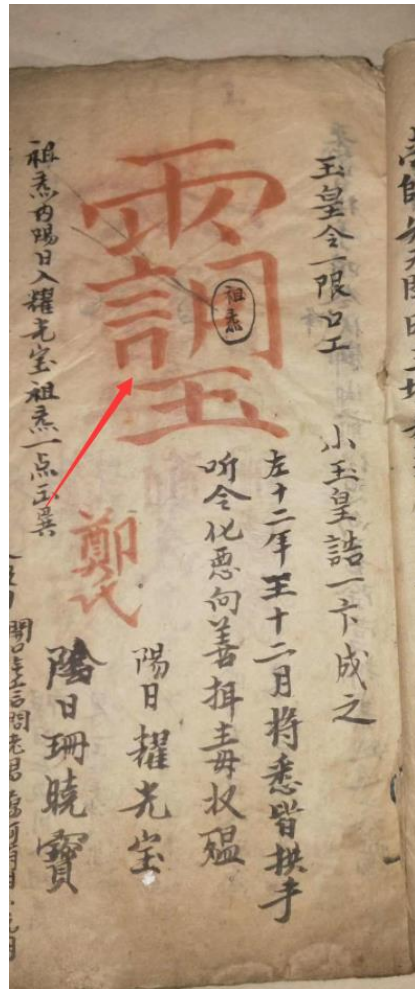


Fig.16 The Secret Name of Yu Huang in a handwritten copy of Daoist Secret characters



When the structure becomes more complicated, the number of its variant may become very large.

4.4 Characters with non-CJKUI components

For example, [UK-20710](#). The provided IDS of UK-20710 is “雨由三三”, the fact is , however, that 三三 is  (U+2637, 坤卦). I don’t think it’s proper to say this is a normal CJKUI.

There are more this kind of characters collected in 《道教諱秘字專用造字集》:















