The SAT Daizokyo Text Database Committee (henceforth, SAT) is an international provider of digital Buddhist resources including Taishō shinshū daizōkyō which consists of over 100 million characters mainly in classical Chinese and a research project of digital Buddhist studies. While the SAT has been conducting digitization of Buddhist resources since 1994, it has been addressing to propose unencoded CJK ideographs used in Buddhist scriptures to the ISO/IEC 10646.

The goals of the SAT are to:

- Promote Buddhist studies in the digital era.
- Develop, publish, and maintain common standard digitized Buddhist texts and related resources in text format and images.
- Provide a platform for Buddhist studies.
