We wish to propose the addition of LATIN CAPITAL LETTER J WITH CROSSED-TAIL in the "Latin Extended-D" block.

The Ik [ikx] language of Uganda has an emerging orthography. The Ik have chosen to use a "j with crossed-tail" to represent the voiced palatal implosive, IPA [f] in their orthography.

The Ik alphabet is:

As there is potential for problems when a case pair is encoded across planes, as noted in L2/12-135 and L2/12-205 (WG2=N4280), we are recommending that LATIN CAPITAL LETTER J WITH CROSSED-TAIL be encoded in the BMP.




Figure 3. LATIN CAPITAL LETTER J WITH CROSSED-TAIL (Ik Alphabet Primer, p. 16).
